Specific Issues of Interest to the CCB:

UK Updates Guidance on Importing Fresh Fruit under BTOM

- On December 1, the United Kingdom's (UK) Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) <u>updated</u> its guidance on *Importing and exporting fresh* fruit and vegetables.
- Starting April 30, 2024, under the UK's new Border Target Operating Model (BTOM) framework for import controls and border biosecurity regime, imports of low-risk fruit and vegetables will no longer need to go through plant health controls, including:
 - Obtaining a phytosanitary certificate for consignments.
 - Pre-notifying the Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) in England and Wales or the Science and Advice for Scottish Agriculture (SASA) in Scotland about consignments.
- Medium risk fruit and vegetable imports will still need to go through these plant health controls.
- The UK published its <u>risk categories for plants and plant products imports from non-EU countries to Great Britian</u> on November 9 (*BCI Monitors 4-14-23*, 8-29-23, 11-14-23).
