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SPECIFIC ISSUES OF INTEREST TO THE CCB:

Japan Notifies Approval of Amended Organic Products of Plant Origin Standard

- On February 16, Japan <u>notified</u> the WTO that the <u>proposed amendments</u> to the Japanese Agricultural Standards (JAS) for Organic Products of Plant Origin (<u>Current Version</u>) were approved and adopted by the Council for the JAS. Details regarding entry into force are not provided.
- Japan previously notified the WTO of the proposed amendments in November 2023 (*BCI Monitor 11-28-23*).
- Of note, the U.S. currently holds an organic equivalence arrangement with Japan.

GENERAL ISSUES OF INTEREST TO THE CCB:

USDA Publishes Translation of China Prepackaged Food Labeling Standard

- On February 12, the U.S. Department of Agriculture Foreign Agricultural Service (USDA FAS) published a <u>report</u> summarizing China's <u>proposed amendments to</u> <u>GB 7718</u> on the labeling of prepackaged food (in Chinese) and included an English translation.
- Of interest to the commission, the definition of prepackaged foods has been modified to include "foods packaged or made up in advance in a package and a container that are sold by weight."
- Notable changes versus the existing *GB7718-2011* standard include:
 - Revised definition of prepackaged foods and extended scope of application to foods prepackaged or prepared in packaging materials and containers and sold in measured quantities
 - Modifications to declaration methods for food names and dates, the list of ingredients, class names, and food additives
 - o Modifications to food allergen declaration requirements
 - o Expanded declaration requirements for imported foods
 - o Addition of digital labeling requirements
 - Addition of requirements for food claims
- China opened a <u>consultation</u> (in Chinese) on the draft on January 19, and <u>notified</u> the WTO on February 9, 2024 (*BCI Monitors 1-23-24, 2-13-24*).

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• Comments may be submitted via China's National Food Safety Standards Information Management System by February 29, 2024. The WTO comment deadline is April 9, 2024.

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Updates to Chinese Food Safety Standards for Packaging Materials Enter into Force

- On March 6, several updates to Chinese food safety standards will enter into force. As previously
 reported, China's National Health Commission (NHC) <u>published</u> the <u>list of updates</u> (in Chinese) on
 September 25, 2023 (*BCI Monitors 9-26-23, 10-24-23*).
- The following food safety standards for packaging materials of interest will enter into force:
 - o GB 4806.7-2023 National food safety standard for plastic and plastic food contact material
 - o GB 4806.9-2023 National food safety standard for metal and metal food contact material
 - GB 4806.11-2023 National food safety standard for rubber and rubber food contact material
 - o GB 4806.14-2023 National food safety standard for inks and ink food contact material
- The USDA's Foreign Agricultural Service (FAS) <u>published</u> an unofficial translation of the Chinese National Health Commission's announcement from September 25. The report only translates the announcement; FAS notes that the full text standards (in Chinese) can be downloaded from the <u>Agricultural Product</u> <u>Quality and Safety Center (Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Affairs)</u>.

England Amends Nutrition and Health Claims Regulations

- On February 20, the United Kingdom (UK) published <u>Statutory Instrument 2024 No. 165, The Nutrition</u> <u>and Health Claims (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2024</u>, which amends the <u>Nutrition and Health</u> <u>Claims (England) Regulations 2007</u> regarding the nutrition and health claims made on product labeling (BCI Monitor 8-15-23).
- The amendment improves the notice procedures for non-compliant product labels or claims by outlining the required information to be provided on a notice, including a timeframe for the correction of claims to be no less than 14 days.
- The amendment enters into force October 1, 2024.

UK Publishes Amendments to Windsor Framework, Guidance Document

- On February 19, the United Kingdom (UK) published <u>The Windsor Framework (UK Internal Market and</u> <u>Unfettered Access) Regulations 2024</u>, making minor amendments to The United Kingdom Internal Market Act 2020 and the Definition of Qualifying Northern Ireland Goods (EU Exit) Regulations 2020 regarding the movement of goods from Northern Ireland to Great Britain (England, Scotland, and Wales).
- The amendments focus on formalizing provisions regarding access, export procedures, and to help in facilitating trade for qualifying Northern Ireland goods to Great Britain.
- Of note, the amendment updates the definition of a 'Northern Ireland qualifying good' to clarify that
 products imported into Northern Ireland from outside the UK with the intent to move to Great Britain are
 not 'Northern Ireland qualifying goods'.
- The amendments entered into force February 20, 2024.
- The UK's Department for Environment, Food, & Rural Affairs (DEFRA) also published a <u>guidance</u> <u>document</u> regarding moving food from Northern Ireland to Great Britain.
