#### GENERAL ISSUES OF INTEREST TO THE CCB:

### Taiwan Notifies Draft Amendments to Recycling and Waste Laws

- On June 17, Taiwan's Ministry of Environment <u>notified</u> the WTO of its consultation on proposed amendments to the *Resource Recycling Act (BCI Monitor 6-3-25)*.
- The notification includes an overview of the draft amendments, including:
  - Expanded Authority & Planning: Central and local authorities will have defined roles in promoting resource circulation, with national and local action plans established and guided by a new advisory council.
  - Eco-Design & Material Use: Guidelines may be set for products and construction to incorporate eco-design and recycled materials.
  - Packaging & Product Regulations: New targets and requirements for reuse, reduction, and restriction of packaging and specified items, with plans and implementation reports required from enterprises.
  - Circular Economy Promotion: Measures include extended product use, digital product info for repair/reuse, and a Circular Label program.
- Proposed dates of adoption and entry into force have yet to be determined.

# Brazil Makes Minor Amendments to Registration Framework for Food and Food Packaging

- On June 5, Brazil's National Health Surveillance Agency (ANVISA) published *Normative Instruction No. 368/2025*, amending *Normative Instruction No.* 281/2024 (both in Portuguese) regarding the framework and procedures for registering food and food packaging in the National Health Surveillance System (SNVS). Brazil also notified the WTO on June 17, 2025.
- ANVISA held consultations on these requirements in September 2022 and first published the updated requirements in March 2024 (*BCI Monitors 9-20-22, 3-5-24*).
- Normative Instruction No. 368/2025 makes minor amendments to language in Annex I, II, V, VI, X included in Normative Instruction No. 281/2024. The Annexes of Normative Instruction No. 281/2024 specify the scope of products and packaging types that are subject to notification and registration with ANVISA.
- Notably, fresh fruit in its natural state is exempt from the requirements according to Annex IV.
- The amendments entered into force June 11, 2025.

### **Brazil Publishes Amendment to Food Contact Material Regulation**

- On June 6, Brazil's National Health Surveillance Agency (ANVISA) published <u>Resolution No. 979</u>, amending <u>RDC No. 88</u>, <u>of June 29</u>, <u>2016</u> (both in Portuguese) regarding cellulose-based food contact materials (FCM) (BCI Monitor 9-3-24). Brazil also <u>notified the WTO</u> on June 17, 2025.
- According to machine translation, the resolution amends Part II of the <u>Annex</u> (Article 2, Item 1.2; in Portuguese) of *RDC No. 88* to include stricter controls on the use of diisopropylnaphthalene in products using recycled fibers.
- The resolution entered into force on June 10, 2025.
