GENERAL ISSUES OF INTEREST TO THE CCB:

Vietnam Notifies Draft Updated Food Safety Law

- On July 30, Vietnam's Food Administration, Ministry of Health <u>notified</u> the WTO of a <u>draft Food Safety Law</u> which will replace the <u>2010 version</u>.
- The Food Safety Law serves as a framework guiding food safety considerations such as production, import, export, advertisement, labeling, and testing; and is enforced through separate specific guidelines and other implementing regulations.
- The notice provides a summary of key changes in the updated framework legislation, including the following:
 - o Updated terminology related to food categories, ingredients, and testing
 - Revised policies to reflect current needs, including a national food database, improved traceability, and stronger e-commerce oversight
 - Introduced new prohibitions on advertising and business practices in ecommerce
 - Clarified and expanded the responsibilities of food businesses and entities registered for product circulation
 - Set clearer conditions for food safety, including for imports/exports and food-related establishments
 - o Amended rules on food advertising, labeling, and testing
 - Refined state food safety management: clarified agency roles, streamlined inspections, and addressed regulatory overlaps
- The proposed date of adoption and publication is October 31, 2025. The proposed date of entry into force is July 1, 2026.

China Extending Section 301 Tariff Exclusions

- China's Ministry of Finance has extended the Section 301 tariff exclusion process for U.S. goods including agricultural products until October 30, 2025, according to a recent USDA FAS GAIN report.
- This update replaces earlier USDA guidance, which reported a cutoff of August 1, 2025, for new applications (*BCI Monitor* 7-22-25). Additionally, approved tariff exclusion applications will now remain valid until December 13, 2025, pushing back the previously reported expiration date of September 14, 2025.
- These new dates are based on reporting by Chinese importers using China's Ministry of Finance website. The Chinese government has not issued any public announcement or explanation about this extension.
